Four-Square Assignment on "A Jury of Her Peers"

Using Susan Glaspell's "Jury of Her Peers," do the assignment below as directed.

Directions:

1. Fold the paper provided to form 4 squares.
2. In the **top left** square, draw a powerful image from what you read in the short story.
3. In the **top right** square, put the picture into words. (Explain your drawing—min. 50 words.)
4. In the **bottom left** square, pretend you are a "Rhetoric Professor," and analyze 2 rhetorical devices elements found in the short story. Use the diction, syntax, and tone that a professor would use.
5. In the **bottom right** square, write an original response to the scene you drew in Square one (1). This response might be a poem, a letter to a friend, a memoir, a serious news article, an *Enquirer*-type news article, etc. Use the short story as a springboard to your own creative endeavor.
